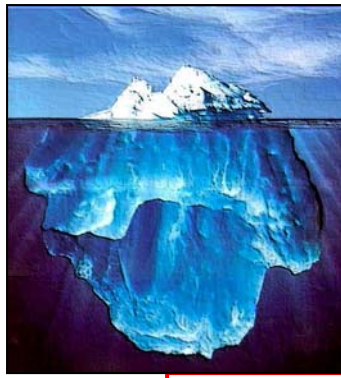

January Highlights

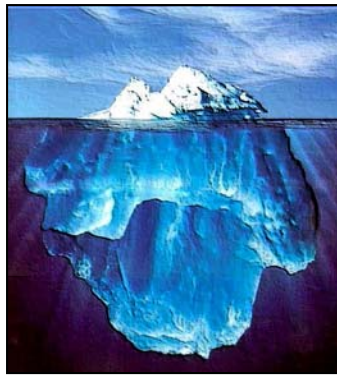
Ench/Salsa/Cougar have reestablished offsite S.T. meetings on 1-13-10.

Increasing Safe Behaviors and Reducing At-Risk Behaviors

A message from Christina Sistrunk: For those of you that haven't heard yet, I am the sponsor for GOM BBSM following transition 2009. I am excited to be taking this role for many reasons. First and foremost, is that I've been associated with BBSM for more than 10 years. In that time, I've seen us mature and improve how we do observations, the role of the local BBSM steering team, and how we use the at risk data to find and eliminate exposure from our work every day. As I mentioned at the Shell BBSM conference in October, how many other change initiatives have you seen last 15 years within Shell? The ownership and commitment of each of our offshore employees has kept this very important program alive and I believe has significantly contributed to our year on year reduction in both lost time injuries and recordable injuries. BBSM is vital to continue our journey toward goal zero - an injury free workplace. To support keeping BBSM moving forward and contributing, we've reformed the central steering team. This effort includes Jon Unwin, VP Deep Water HSE, Jeff Walter, HSE Tech Supervisor, Tony Johnson and Tony Cantrelle, BBSM coaches, and Dale Ramsey, Operations Manger champion for BBSM within the Production Leadership Team. Our role is to listen to feedback from the locations including the local BBSM teams, to review progress vs.. the Rev 8 goals, and using that information, provide support to the local teams and leadership to reinforce the good things, encourage getting back on track where needed, and to make sure that all the locations have access to the education and tools needed to make their locations successful. So, if you have ideas on how to strengthen our program, we'd love to hear from you. My personal vision is to enable all of our teams to clearly define their goals for improvement, achieve those goals and be in a position where we can go to the BST annual conference in 2011 and be able to teach more than we learn to the other companies that participate. To do this, we will need to focus on making it easier for people to intervene and document interventions in a consistent way for all critical behaviors (including those that impact Life Saving Rules) - we can do this by a combination of making the most of the Rev 8 training and utilizing the experience of the BBSM coaches. Once we do that and can get to the point where we are seeing most of our at risk behaviors (which should be over 10% of our total observations according to bench marks), we can use the data to put together quality plans to remove these exposures from our business. Some locations are already doing this. Through better work plans focused on key exposures and training on how to best avoid these exposures, they are showing how to eventually eliminate them. When we use this to see and eliminate the exposure, before someone gets hurt we send people home injury free and we move toward Goal Zero. I know this is something we can all agree on.

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
