
RE: Reclamation plantings on Shell locations

To all Service Companies,

This letter is to inform you that Shell has been in the process of reclaiming pads to meet criteria outlined in the Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) Record of Decision (ROD). In doing so, each pad is evaluated to retain a limited working area for facilities, which includes a tanker truck turn around radius of 130'. The truck turn around area has been determined through aerial imagery for most pads as the current travel route used. We are in the process of trailing several different barriers to prohibit travel on the newly seeded reclaimed areas. We ask that you please do not drive over berms that have been created on pads, through fences, other means of deterrence, or areas that have been re-contoured and seeded. We are also asking that any snow plowing that takes place is within the areas used by facilities and wells only, and not in any reclaimed, reseeded areas. When plowing these areas, please leave a 3" snow mat to ensure that any vegetation that may be growing is left intact to the soil.

To accomplish the criteria set forth in the ROD, it will take a team effort. We are asking you to be on this team to do your part to make reclamation successful. Attached are a few photos of area that are planned for seeding, illustrating some of the efforts that you will see in the field this fall. Again, we appreciate your positive attitude toward stabilizing soils and recreating habitat that will be used by both wildlife and cattle.


